



OUR NEW WEBSITE IS COMING!! NO, REALLY! PLEASE READ ON...

We have been saying for several months now that our new WOLRA website is nearing completion and we expected to have specific completion dates for you by now. However, we have run into a couple of issues that have necessitated that our developer, Lure Marketing of Kingston, request changes to a Plug-in App on Calendaring from the original App developers.

We are confident that the issues, particularly around room bookings, will be fixed shortly and we will launch the new website by mid-April. We have the launch plan developed and in place, ready to activate as soon as we are satisfied that the new WOLRA Website is fully operational and ready to serve the needs of our community.

Here is the plan:

First, we will issue a Special Eblast to inform everyone of the date that the new website will be "turned on" and open to everyone. This means that the new website will be open for everyone to inspect, explore and investigate at the same time that the old website will still be up and available for our use. We hope that residents will check out the new site and report any problems or errors that are found. We will endeavour to open a "perfect, error-free" site, but we are not naïve, and we do expect that there will be glitches, hopefully minor, and we will correct them quickly.

In the same Special Eblast we will list the dates and times of several "Information Sessions" that will be scheduled over a three-day period in the Rec Centre. These sessions will be about one hour long and will introduce and describe the website and all the new functionality, such as Room Bookings, that are available – there will be time to answer your questions.

Secondly, we will send an email to every WOLRA member detailing how to "login" to the site, and it will contain your individual username and provide instructions on how to establish your individual password – yes, for security reasons there will be no more standard use passwords, and no one will be able to access the Member Portal without logging in with their individual username and password.

Finally, we will issue a second Special Eblast, approximately a week to 10 days after the new site is "turned on" and it will provide the date when the new WOLRA website will "Go Live". On that date the old website will be taken down and we will use the new site for all our needs.

One last plea for your help...Doug Henderson will take on the role of Webmaster through the final web development stages and the launch and early use of the new website. However, this cannot be a long-term position for Doug, and we are asking for volunteers with solid website and computer skills to come forward and volunteer to be our new webmaster. If you have any questions or would like to volunteer, please contact either Doug Henderson wolra.vice@gmail.com or myself wolra.vice@gmail.com or myself wolra.comm@gmail.com. The new WOLRA website is the centrepiece of our communication plan for the community, and we really do require a WOLRA member to step up and take on the Webmaster role...please consider volunteering.

I would like to thank the Website Committee for all its hard work and the long hours, and we will be in touch with everyone very soon.

The County is in the "path of totality" where the sun will be completely blocked by the moon. This once-in-a-lifetime event will not happen again until 2399, more than 400 years from now. Here, the total eclipse is predicted to begin at 3:21 pm and last for 3 minutes and 2 seconds.

COUNCIL POISED TO ELIMINATE WELLINGTON BEACH ADMISSION FEE

Excerpt:

"Julianne Snepsts, Programs Supervisor proposed creating a Municipal Accommodation Tax-funded "Beach Steward" position to proactively clean, maintain, monitor and assist the public at the beach. The County will also consider recruiting up to two food vendors for the beach food truck program. The changes with the fee and the addition of a beach steward were exactly what Wellington Coun. Corey Englesdorfer was hoping for. Free access to the beach was one of the perks of The PEC Summer Pass program. That

program will continue this summer offering County residents free parking at water access points at the ends of Bakker Road and Huyck's Point Road. In 2024, residents will be able to re-use the yellow PEC Summer Passes that they obtained in 2022 or 2023 as long as the vehicle information on the pass is still valid. The yellow passes would be phased out at the end of 2024. Anyone requiring a new pass in 2024 will be issued a new design, which will be valid for three years and include an expiry date.






This is the 20th year that the Rotary Club of Wellington has been selling the Diners & Duffers booklets.





INVENTOR OF THE KARAOKE MACHINE DIES AT 100

On January 29th, the man who invented the karaoke machine passed away after having a fall at the age of 100. Shigeichi Negishi was born in Tokyo in 1923 and grew up to run an electronics company.

His lightbulb moment came when a colleague heard him singing at work and mocked him for how bad it was. He thought to himself that if he could sing to a backing track, it would change everything, and in 1967 the world had its first karaoke machine, the Sparko Box.



Before his career in electronics, Negishi was in the Japanese military and was subsequently a prisoner of

war in various camps in Singapore. After being released, he returned to Japan and used the English language skills he picked up as a POW to sell cameras.

Negishi chose the name karaoke as it had long been used in Japan to refer to singers who used backing tracks to perform. The word itself is a mixture of the words 'empty' and 'orchestra' in Japanese.

Despite his idea sparking a worldwide craze, it didn't make him millions as he never patented the invention – and even gave up making the singalong boxes as he 'grew tired of the conflict with musicians and the grind of door-to-door sales and maintenance.

However, his daughter, Atsumi Takano, said he was happy just to know that his idea had grown into something so enjoyed: 'He felt a lot of pride in seeing his idea evolve into a culture of having fun through song around the world. *Source: DailyMail.com UK March 16th*







Prince Edward County (PEC)'s first film festival, the County Adaptation Film Festival (CAFF) will host its first gala screening on May 4th, 2024 at the historic Regent Theatre in Picton, Ontario as a preview event to its festival this coming September. The conversation begins on May 4th with a screening of Hugh Welchman and DK Welchman's THE PEASANTS. Like the festival to come, this special engagement will feature an exclusive conversation with artists and an exciting activation which invites the audience to consider the art of adaptation. Alongside the screening, CAFF will also reveal the full festival branding, introduce the festival's participating venues and programming partners and share the full festival schedule.

THE PEASANTS is an adaptation of Władysław Reymont's Nobel Prize-winning novel CHŁOPI. Utilizing the painted animation audiences came to know in LOVING VINCENT, THE PEASANTS was hand-painted by over 200 artists in four studios in Poland, Lithuania, Ukraine and Serbia over five years of production. Originally shot with actors, the artists put brush to canvas to create oil paintings that would become the frames in the film. Animators then worked to supplement the paintings to create the final product.

The preview event will feature an exhibition of original oil paintings created for the film, a virtual introduction by the filmmakers and a post-show discussion with one of the film's creative team. Paintings will have been selected for exhibition in partnership with the event's title sponsor Oeno Gallery.

"Aside from being a visually stunning film, and a creative feat involving thousands of paintings and hundreds of artists, THE PEASANTS encapsulates the spirit of adaptation that our festival seeks to explore," said Alexandra Seay, Co-founder & Artistic Director of CAFF. "Our festival invites audiences to think about the process of adaptation in all forms; in this case, from page to screen and from live action on greenscreen to oil on canvas. The film presents a jumping-off point for a multi-faceted conversation. I am utterly thrilled to be able to bring the physical paintings to Picton. Consider this a taste of things to come in September."

Hugh Welchman will provide a virtual introduction to the film. But the evening's in-person guest will be Monika Folkierska-Zukowska who served on THE PEASANTS as a director's assistant, a visual effects artist, and a script supervisor. Ms. Folkierska-Zukowska will participate in an exclusive on-stage conversation on the process of adapting the film and the many visual influences on the painting.

CAFF is a project of Picton's Regent Theatre. The festival advisory committee includes Michèle Maheux, Hussain Amarshi, Tim Smythe-Bishop & Devyani Saltzman. The planning team features The Regent Theatre's Executive Director, Alexandra Seay as Co-Founder and Artistic Director and John Galway of Corrib Entertainment as Festival Producer. HISTORIC LANCASTER BOMBER MOVES TO BASE 31 IN PICTON

Avro Lancaster bomber KB 882, a rare icon of Canada's aviation history from the Second World War, traveled to Picton as part of a new partnership between the National Air Force Museum of Canada at CFB Trenton and Base31. The Trenton-based museum said it was transporting the retired Royal Canadian Air Force Lancaster KB 882 in pieces on a fleet of five flatbed trucks into Picton.

Amid ongoing RCAF 100th anniversary celebrations, Base31 said it will then host the plane for four to five years in the covered, safe environment of the Base31 museum that allows for continued restoration efforts until it returns to its permanent home at the air force museum located at CFB Trenton. To coincide with the RCAF's Centennial celebrations, the NAFMC will unveil Lancaster KB 882 to the public over the course of a few days in June 2024 at Base31.

"The NAFMC board of directors is thrilled to be partnering with Base31 as we work towards completing the restoration of KB 882", said Susan Scarborough, air force museum chair, in a news release.

"Celebrating our site's past is an integral part of the creation of Base31 as a cultural destination here in The County. The Lancaster KB 882 is not only an important national artefact, but a vital symbol and reminder that the fight for freedom and democracy continues to this day", said Tim Jones, CEO, Base31. "We are so pleased to be partnering with the NAFMC to showcase this remarkable part of our collective history."


